He is also leading the city's first Climate Risk and Vulnerability Assessment and will touch on recent public workshops involving this assessment. BLUE GROSBEAK (PASSERINA CAERULEA) Lindsay Grossmann

Perhaps the best description of the Blue Grosbeak is a "jumbo-sized Indigo Bunting." The males are mostly blue, but have an orangy-brown pair of wingbars. The females are primarily brown, but also sport the large triangular-shaped bill that is responsible for half the bird's name.

Blue Grosbeaks are mostly a southern species, but are expanding their range northward where there is suitable habitat. They prefer old fields and forest edges - where you'll find a mixture of grasses, shrubs, and occasional trees. There they forage on a mixture of invertebrates and seeds. They'll often perch up high to sing their warbly song. Their population could be deemed "uncommon" but stable and they can be found reliably in certain areas around the state. In our area, places to look include Beverly Crone and Boot Lake. They will be leaving shortly for their overwintering grounds in Central America and the Caribbean.
