Early spring rains definitely brought the May flowers. What a beautiful time of year! The arrival of migrating birds brought wonderful sights and sounds also. As we look towards summer at the Sanctuary, we'll enjoy the shade of towering trees, the flowers in the fields that attract many insects, and the coolness of the pond area with the sound of frogs plopping into the water. The metal sign that Doug had made has been attached to the shed that Vic Riemenschneider built to house the outdoor grills (see the last page of this issue). Doug has been out to mow the sanctuary parking lot and trails. Our next work day will be July 1st from 8:00 a.m. to noon. We'll prepare the Sanctuary for the pancake breakfast that will take place on July 4<sup>th</sup>. Tasks to be worked on are cleaning the tables and benches in the summer quarters, mowing and trimming trails, checking supplies for the pancake breakfast, and any invasive plant removal if time allows. Please dress for the weather. Gloves and tools are available. Refreshments will be supplied.

#### JUNE FIELD TRIP

#### Carol Goodall, Field Trip Chair

This month we will be headed to Michigan on June 17<sup>th</sup> to Mud Lake Bog. This will be more of a botany trip, but we may see a few birds. Our main goal on this trip is to see carnivorous plants. Mud Lake Bog is the best place in our area to see these plants because the boardwalk sits right on top of the bog. We will see pitcher plants and both sundew species (round-leaved and spatulate-leaved).

I strongly suggest wearing long sleeves and long pants because poison sumac may overhang the boardwalk in some places, but we will keep a careful eye out for it. Bring water, sunscreen, and insect repellent.

We may go to lunch afterwards. There is a nice brewery in Bridgman. We can decide this on the day of the field trip.

Meet at Mud Lake Bog, located at 905 E. Elm Valley Road in Buchanan, Michigan, at 8:30 a.m. This nature preserve is only about a 30- to 45-minute drive from South Bend.

#### AUGUST FIELD TRIP

On August 26<sup>th</sup>, we will head to the Lake Michigan lakefront in search of shorebirds. We will begin our morning at Washington Park Beach in Michigan City, Indiana and will explore the pier at the Michigan City Lighthouse. If we don't find any shorebirds there, we have several more options around the lakefront we might explore. We will discuss things as we go. This will be a longer day. It should be a wonderful time to be at the lake and fall migration will have begun.

Meet at 7:30 a.m. eastern time at the far northwest corner of the parking lot in Washington Park Beach. This is the area of the parking lot closest to the lighthouse. The entrance to the park is at City Hall and 100 E. in Michigan City, Indiana.

There shouldn't be a gate fee if we get there this early but still be prepared to pay a gate fee. We may also visit other locations which may require a gate fee.

Bring sunscreen, water, and binoculars if you have them. I will have a spotting scope and extra binoculars for us to use. You may also want to bring some snacks. We might find a place to get a bite to eat for lunch. We will decide this on the day of the field trip. Or you may prefer to pack a lunch.

July 8<sup>th</sup>, we'll be taking a field trip to Beverly Crone Restoration Area in search of grassland birds. Our target birds on this trip will be Eastern Meadowlark, Henslow's Sparrow, Sedge Wren, Bobolink, and Dickcissel. We will need to get an early start to beat the heat of the day as there is no shade at the property. Trails are gravel and slightly hilly.

Beverly Crone Restoration Area is located at 21448 Jackson Road in South Bend. Meet at 7:00 a.m. at the parking area on the corner of Jackson and Locust.

# BLACK-THROATED BLUE WARBLER (SETOPHAGA CAERULESCENS) Lindsay Grossmann

The well-named Black-throated Blue Warbler is in effect a warbler that has a blue upper third of its body and a black face and throat. They are rounded out with a very white belly/underside with few other marks aside from a white square or "check" in their wing. Well, at least the male is well-named. The female looks so different that in fact it was once thought to be another species! She is olive-gray all over with a lighter eyeline. But she does retail that white "check" that is unique to this species. In that way, she is one of the easiest to identify female warblers that come through our area.

This species winters in the Caribbean and nests just to the north of us in Northern Michigan and then east over to southeastern Canada and the New England states. If you vacation in the Appalachian Mountains this summer, you might also see them nesting there. In northern Indiana, we see them only during migration, both spring and fall. They are uncommon in that the males don't lose their breeding colors as many warblers do in fall. They tend to prefer lower to mid-vegetation, where they glean insects off of trees and shrubs. Males proclaim their slothfulness by singing "I am so lazzzzy!" any chance they can.
